Instruction Guideline – The Innovation School

Date and Time of Planned Instruction: March 30, 2021

Length of Planned Instruction: 2 hours

Literacy Connection (Book): "The Pout-Pout Fish

Planned Line of Inquiry (Leading Question for Discussions)

- 1. "Tell me something you already know about fishes or ocean animals?"
- 2. "What are emotions?"
- 3. "What do you think this book will be about?"
- 4. "What do you do when you feel sad to make yourself feel better?"
- 5. "What do you think will happen in the book?"

Gross Motor/Movement Components/TIS Standards:

We will have an art gallery walk after students are done with their pout-pout fishes.

Moving around like different pout-pout fishes.

Art/Sensory Components/TIS Standards:

Art/Sensory: We will create our own pout-pout fishes with paper plates, markers, beads, etc.

They will get to name it, decided if its happy, sad, mad, etc.

Math/Literacy Components/TIS Standards:

Math: Students will count their beads as they put them on their pout-pout fishes. Adding beads on the pout fish while rolling dice.

Literacy: Students and I will write a short play with our pout-pout fishes. Asking what happened in the book.

Science/Social Studies Components/TIS Standards:

Social Studies: Have students look up fish and ocean animals and look on a map on where they are at located at.

Science: temperatures of the areas of where the fish are at in the water. Salt water and regular water. Fish laying eggs.

Planned Student Reflection Components

Art gallery walk: students will walk and look at all of the pout-pout fishes and ask what they are named, how the fish is feeling, why they used that bead there... etc. Students will use kind and helpful feedback.

Learning Objectives:

- By the end of the lesson students will express a broad range of emotions.
- By the end of the lesson students will recognize these emotions in self and others.
- By the end of the lesson students will be able to learn about ocean animals and make geographical/biological connections to those animals.
